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

Aim To help responders be safe, effective, competent, and confident during their response to an incident involving hazardous materials.






Phase 1 recap



- Risk awareness and pre-planning.

Initial information gathering






Final approach



- Use weather information to ensure an upwind approach where possible.
- Approach from higher ground where possible, especially when dealing with liquids.
- Stay clear of vapour, fumes, smoke and spills.
- Slow your approach speed.
- Use your senses and incident indicators.
- Do not park in potential blast/hazard zone.
- Establish command post in a safe location uphill and upwind.
- Remember downwind, dilution, obstacle, oscillation and retention (DDOOR), if dealing with a vapour/gas or plume in a built up area.
- Consider the generic initial cordon guidance.
